What does E mean on a solar panel?

This is the amount of light reaching the solar panel and is measured in watts per square metre. Under Standard Test Conditions, $E = 1000\text{W/m}^2$. This also happens to be approximately the amount of solar radiance received at the earth's surface at sea level.

What is a solar panel datasheet?

A solar panel datasheet is a document that includes information about the specifications and test results of a solar panel. In the datasheet, you may also find certificates showing that the manufacturer's product has been independently tested and found to conform to certain test conditions and industry standards.

What protects photovoltaic cells?

Front Cover, back cover, frame- This tells us what's protecting the photovoltaic cells. An anodized aluminum frame is standard for crystalline solar panels. 3.2 mm is in the standard range for front glass. Solar cell type - Monocrystalline, polycrystalline, and thin film are the most common types of cells.

What does a solar panel rating mean?

Now, let's explore the meaning of each solar panel rating. The Wattage rating of a solar panel is the most fundamental rating, representing the maximum power output of the solar panel under ideal conditions. You'll often see it referred to as "Rated Power", "Maximum Power", or "Pmax", and it's measured in watts or kilowatts peak (kWp).
